Park Fiction – That is: Art as utopia, art as social work, art as work coming out of the separated sphere of galleries and museums to make it into the 'real life'.

St. Pauli is Hamburg's poorest quarter, characterized by social weakness and the Red Light District. In the mid-nineties, St. Pauli and its inhabitants were in search of alternative ways of living. At the same time, plans were made for the commercial development of the last free areas near Hamburg harbor. Luckily, these two conflicting development concepts did not end in riots – as was very common during these years in St. Pauli. Instead, a constructive resistance movement was initiated by artists and musicians. That action group had a new idea for a solution: A park! A public green space which should be constructed with residents' help and which should include people's personal dreams. The city planners were convinced, and the initiative became an art project presented at the documenta 11.

The new building complex will comprise three concert halls, a hotel with an international conference area, apartments, a plaza at a height of 37 meters, a wellness area and a large number of parking spaces in the Warehouse A. The complex was based on designs by the renowned Swiss architects Herzog & de Meuron.
